

SUBJECT: VFW Update

BACKGROUND

We have invited representatives from New Richmond/St. Croix County VFW Post 10818 to provide an update on the proposed VFW building within Freedom Park. The purpose of this meeting is to outline the timeline, concepts, and parameters for the VFW building.

RE: Assessor - Revaluation Proposal

Background

At the 2016 Board of Review, we discussed the inconsistencies that Owen Assessing has found throughout the City. The Board asked Kelly Owen to submit a proposal for a complete revaluation for consideration by the Council. Attached is the proposed contract. They would go to every property with a building and attempt to gain access. If the property owners do not let them in, they will be sent a refusal letter so they know they will not be allowed to appear at the Board of Review if no access to the interior is granted. The revaluation would take 9 to 10 months to complete and the cost could be spread over three years at \$75,150 each year. This cost includes the revaluation and two years of maintenance. Kelly Owen will be at the meeting to answer any questions.

Recommendation

Staff has been impressed with the quality of service provided by Owen Assessing and recommends Council consideration of a revaluation.

**CONTRACT FOR ASSESSMENT SERVICES
BETWEEN
City of New Richmond and Owen Assessing LLC**

IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN City of New Richmond in St. Croix County Wisconsin, a municipal corporation (hereafter "Municipality") and Owen Assessing LLC, E3571 810th Ave Menomonie WI (hereafter "Assessment Service") as follows:

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

- A. Inspections. The following maintenance inspection cycle is to be completed by Assessment Service, namely:
 - 1. New construction, annexed properties, and exempt status changes shall be physically inspected;
 - 2. Properties affected by building removal, fire, significant remodeling (those requiring a building permit), or other major condition changes shall be physically inspected;
 - 3. All sales properties, legal description changes, and zoning changes shall be reviewed and inspected if deemed necessary to ensure a fair assessment.
 - 4. Requests for review of assessment by property owners shall be physically inspected during the current assessment cycle.

- B. Parcel Identification. The legal description, drawing and measurements of improvements shall be contained in the existing property record cards. Drawing shall be made for all new records. In the event of a discrepancy exists, the Assessment Service shall investigate and correct the record.

- C. Preparation of Record Cards. Appropriate record cards shall be used in the evaluation and collection of data for residential improvements, commercial improvements, and agricultural improvements. All information relating to the improvements shall be obtained and shown as provided on the respective forms. The Assessment Service shall supply to the County, a complete set of property records on computer readable format thru Market Drive Software Program which is compatible with County's software and update the computer accessible records within fourteen (14) days of final adjournment of the Board of Review.

- D. Open Book Conference. Upon completion of the Assessment Service review of assessments and prior to completion of the assessment rolls, the Assessment Service shall hold an open book conference for the purpose of enabling property owners or their agents to review and

compare the assessed values. The Assessment Service shall send notice to each property owner of any change in assessment. The notice form used shall be that prescribed by the Department of Revenue, and include the time and place the open book conference(s) will be held. Mailing shall not be less than ten (10) days prior to the first day of the conferences for the convenience of property owners.

- E. Completion of Assessment Roll. The Assessment Service shall be responsible for the proper completion of the assessment roll in accordance with current statutes. Final assessment figures for each property shall be provided by the Assessment Service to the Municipality, and the roll shall be totaled to exact balance. All information shall be submitted to the County Real Property Lister in a computerized format compatible with the County's program. The Assessment Service shall prepare and submit the "Assessor's Final Report".
 - F. Board of Review Attendance. The Assessment Service shall attend all hearings of the City Board of Review to explain and defend the assessed value and be prepared to testify under oath in regard to the values determined. In the event of appeal to the Department of Revenue or the Courts, the Assessment Service shall be available upon request of the Municipality to furnish testimony in defense of the values determined.
 - G. Personal Property Assessments. The Assessment Service shall mail out from a list supplied by the Municipality annual personal property statements, and by May first each year, review statements and follow up with unfilled or incorrect statements. The Assessment Service shall determine the appropriate assessment amount.
 - H. Determine use value assessment penalty for agricultural land conversions under Sec. 74.485 and report to the County Treasurer and Municipal Clerk.
 - I. Public Requests and Availability. The Assessment Service shall timely respond to all open records requests. The Assessment Service shall maintain a telephone service with at least a 24 hour answering machine to receive calls from the Municipality or property owners. The Assessment Service shall timely respond to all telephone inquiries.
2. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.
- A. Conformance to Statutes. All work of the Assessment Service shall be accomplished in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Wisconsin and with all the rules and regulations officially adopted and

promulgated by the Wisconsin Department of Revenue and the Municipality.

- B. Oath of Office. The Assessment Service shall be required to take and subscribe to an oath or affirmation supporting the Constitution of the United States and to the State of Wisconsin and to faithfully perform the duties of Assessor. If the Assessment Service is a corporation or partnership, the person designated as responsible for the assessment shall comply with the above. The oath shall conform to Section 19.01 and filed with the Municipal Clerk prior to commencing duties.
- C. Qualifications and Conduct of Personnel. The Assessment Service shall provide at his/her own expense any personnel necessary and to comply with the following:
1. All personnel providing services shall be currently certified in compliance with Sec. 73.09, Wis. Stats., and the administrative rules prescribed by the Wisconsin Department of Revenue.
 2. The Assessment Service shall submit to the Municipality a résumé containing the name, address, education and prior experience of each employee anticipated to provide assessing services to the Municipality. Employees of the company who are later hired or were not anticipated to provide such services at the time of this Contract, shall submit appropriate information for approval of the Municipality before field inspection work is started by the employee.
 3. All employees, agents, or representatives of the Assessment Service shall conduct themselves in a safe, sober, and courteous manner while performing services within the Municipality.
 4. The Assessment Service shall review any complaint relative to the conduct of his/her employees and take appropriate corrective action. If the Municipality deems the performance of any of Assessment Service's, employees unsatisfactory, the Assessment Service shall, for good cause, remove such employees from work upon written request by Municipality, such request stating reasons for removal.
 5. The Assessment Service shall supply all of his/her field representatives with identification cards, including the name, company, telephone number and photograph of the employee.
 6. In connection with the performance of work under this contract, the Assessment Service shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, religion, color, handicap, sex, physical condition, developmental disability as defined in Section 51.01 (5), Wis. Stats. Or national origin. This provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer, recruitment or recruiting

advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Assessment Service agrees to post in a conspicuous place available for employees and applications for employment notices to be provided by the contracting officer setting forth provision of the nondiscrimination clause.

- D. Ownership of Records. All records prepared or maintained in connection with assessments in the Municipality shall at all times be and remain the sole property of the Municipality. During the term of this contract, the Assessment Service may have possession of these records, but upon termination of the contract, the Assessment Service shall turn all records over to the Municipality within seven (7) days. Such records include, but are not limited to; (a) property record cards, maps, and other schedules and forms, (b) all records and material obtained from the Municipality and not previously returned to include maps, plans, and assessor's records, and (c) material specifically obtained and/or used for performance of assessment work for the Municipality, to include correspondence with property owners, sales data, and operating statements of income property.
- E. Status, Change of Ownership or Operations. The Assessment Service acknowledges and agrees:
1. Owen Assessing LLC, is an independent contractor to the Municipality, and that Owen Assessing LLC, business is independently owned and operated and that nothing in this contract shall be interpreted to cause or result in, directly or indirectly, any principal-agent or employer-employee relationship between the Assessment Service and the Municipality and that nothing in this contract shall in any way be construed as an agreement of partnership, general or limited, joint venture, or as an agency relationship whatsoever between the Assessment Service and the Municipality. The Assessment Service shall not represent or advertise in any way that his/her relationship with the Municipality is other than stated herein.
 2. The Assessment Service shall notify the Municipality within five (5) days of any change in majority or more ownership or change in chief operating officer.
- F. Assessment Service Provided Insurance and Indemnity. The Assessment Service agrees as follows:
1. The Assessment Service shall obtain and maintain during the term of this contract full coverage insurance to protect and hold harmless the Municipality which insurance is to include: (a) workers compensation in compliance with State laws, (b) comprehensive general and public

liability covering operation, (c) comprehensive automobile liability and property damage with coverage to include owned, hired, and non-hired motor vehicles used by Assessment Service with the following minimum limits: Bodily injury \$500,000/person - \$1,000,000/occurrence; Property damage \$250,000/occurrence.

2. The Assessment Service shall carry proper and sufficient insurance to cover loss of records.
3. The Assessment Service shall provide the Municipality with certificates for all required insurance, with the Municipality as a named insured. All insurance coverage shall contain a 10 day advance notice of cancellation to the Municipality. The Assessment Service shall timely pay all insurance premiums.
4. Liability for bodily injury, disability, and/or death of employees or any person or for damage to property caused in any way, directly or indirectly, by the operations of the Assessment Service within the Municipality shall be assumed by the Assessment Service and Assessment Service shall indemnify and hold harmless the Municipality against all claims, actions, proceedings, damages, and liabilities, including reasonable attorney's fees, arising from or connected with the Assessment Service activities in connection with the services provided to the Municipality, including but not limited to, any acts or omissions of the Assessment Service, his/her employees, agents, representatives, and any other person doing business with Assessment Service. This paragraph is not to be in conflict with Sec. 893.89(4), Wis. Stats.

3. TERM AND TERMINATION.

- A. **The term of this Contract shall be from January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2020.**
- B. Either party may terminate this Contract only with cause, cause being defined as default of the other party of terms of this Contract, upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party. Upon termination by either party, Assessment Service shall deliver to the Municipality all records and materials in the Assessment Service's possession used or created during this Contract. During the 60 day wind down time, both the Assessment Service and the Municipality shall act in good faith with each other and cooperate in the orderly transfer of records.
- C. Either party may request of the other party a renewal or extension of this contract any time after July 1, 2018, which decision shall be accomplished before September 1, 2020.

4. COMPENSATION. **The City of New Richmond will be billed for Assessment Services in 4 installments:** March 1, June 1, October 1, and December 1, for the years 2018 - 2020 tax roll in the amount respectively of \$ 18,787.50.00 each installment for 12 installments equal to total contract of (\$225,450.00 for 3 years of one Full Revaluation and 2 Maintenance assessments service). The assessment service will provide a brief summary of services rendered along with each billing cycle.

- A. The Municipality will be responsible for all costs of Market Drive software updates, and to meet with new State of Wisconsin electronic requirements. Postage for mailings will be provided by assessment firm.
- B. The Municipality agrees to pay for all attorney fees in defending any assessments. The Assessment Service shall also be compensated \$50.00 per hour preparing for court and \$100.00 per hour when attending court.
- C. The Assessment Service shall be responsible for all incidental costs related to assessment work, including but not limited to, mileage.
- D. The Municipality shall purchase the plat maps from the County for assessment use, and pay the county for updates annually. This will be done as they are listed above to be the property of the Municipality.





SUBJECT: Senior Center Lease

During the work session meeting on September 28th, we will discuss a proposed senior center lease agreement. The Council would be asked to formally approve the lease agreement during their meeting on October 10th. Below are the proposed terms of the lease.

- Hours: Monday-Thursday 8 am -2 pm
- On Department of Motor Vehicle days the seniors will located in the Council Chambers
- The seniors will reimburse the city for the financial commitment in Sept-Dec 2016
- The City's financial commitment in future years beginning in 2017 will be \$0 annually
- On days of elections, the senior center will be closed
- If a community event is needed, or if the basement room is needed, a two week notice will be given for the space
- The City will be allowed to utilize this space after the hours of 2 pm Monday-Thursday and all day Friday
- The lease will be reviewed on an annual basis

SUBJECT: 2017 Budget Process

BACKGROUND

The preparation for the 2017 budget began in late July with a review of existing financial conditions of the 2016 budget. In late August, the City Council and members of the Utility Commission boarded a bus to listen to budget updates from department heads and tour various projects and facilities throughout the city.

During the work session on September 28th, City staff will provide an overview of the 2017 budget process, including additional information related to the following:

1. Brief overview of the budget tour. We will ask the Mayor and City Council for their key takeaways from this tour.
2. Overview of existing conditions. We'll present a historic overview of the City's financial position over the past ten years as well as outline/juxtapose the City's mill rate compared to other taxing authorities.
3. Overview of debt capacity as well as sources of funds. We'll discuss the impact of the recent street projects related to our overall debt service levy.
4. Allocation of overall operating expenses. We'll provide a brief overview of the City's operating expenses over the last six years.

5. Innovation Team Ideas. This year we have designated our department heads as the "Innovation Team." Our collective task is to come up with ideas for limiting spending while providing (and, as needed, expending) services. These ideas will include:

- a. Sell off City-owned parcels
- b. Maximize purchasing by centralizing purchasing of supplies for all departments
- c. Shop our health insurance to ensure quality health insurance at the best value, and enhancing the City's wellness policies
- d. Propose no new borrowing in 2017. Funding for a proposed fire truck would come from a bridge loan through New Richmond Utilities
- e. Increase administrative spending for the City's library
- f. Increase funding for streets and sidewalks
- g. Review of residential and industrial developments currently excluded from Property Tax Equivalent payable by the Utility per Resolution #041002.

SUBJECT: Fire Advisory Board Meeting- 2017 Budget Updates

During the last Fire Advisory meeting, Chief Vander Wyst presented the first draft of the 2017 budget process. The 2017 budget included updates on both on-going general fund expenditures as well as needed capital equipment improvements. Among those improvements includes a new fire truck, new vehicle and trailer.

During our next Fire Advisory Board meeting on October 6th, we will present proposed changes to the FY2017 budget. The most notable changes include the following:

1. Utilities and Telephone- We anticipate a \$4,000 increase in these costs based upon "actual" costs incurred from previous years.
2. Supplies and Equipment- We anticipate a \$3,270 cost increase of a hose and SCBA test equipment.
3. Retirement Funds- We have budgeted an additional \$3,265 in retirement funding based upon an updated classification for the Fire Chief as I outlined during the last Fire Advisory Board meeting.
4. Training and Education- We anticipate a slight increase in training and fees. \$832.
5. Salaries- The proposed budget includes a 2.4-3% increase, however any increase will require City Council approval which would occur later this fall.
6. Administrative Fees- This is a new line-item and includes payroll, bookkeeping, recorders, IT and analyst support based upon a full time equivalent. This total is \$33,382. The analyst fee includes grant writing services. As you may be aware, the Fire Department was awarded a \$144,500 grant for new firefighters over the next three years. We anticipate additional funding options in FY2017.

7. Rescue Equipment-We are recommending \$54,478 to replace the Chief's vehicle and improvements of the rescue trailer.

We'll provide additional updates on each of these items during the upcoming meeting. Attached is the proposed budget by municipality. As part of our next presentation, we'll discuss the 2017 budget as well as anticipated funding for 2018.

Re: Municipal Forfeiture Increase

Judge Keating is requesting that an increase in most municipal forfeitures be approved and be made effective immediately. The last increase was made effective 11-26-2013. In consideration of the changes in our community, particularly those anticipated by the completion of the Stillwater bridge, it is the opinion of the court that an increase is both timely and necessary.

When determining the proposed increases, the court considered the forfeitures imposed by surrounding communities as well as the individual needs of New Richmond now and in the future. The court also consulted with Chief Yehlik to better understand the NRPD perspective regarding particular areas in which justice and prevention would be better served by the proposed increases.





SUBJECT: K-9 Program Update

During the last City Council meeting, Police Chief Yehlik and Lieutenant Koehler presented information related to a proposed K-9 Unit within the New Richmond Police Department. This program was discussed as part of the Public Safety Committee meeting in August. Based upon the time needed to identify a handler, secure a K-9 for this program, secure funding, and conduct training, staff recommend that this program begin in 2018.

Since the last City Council meeting, staff recommend the following process for this program:

- September: Develop a funding agreement for potential contributors (see attached).
- October/November: Meet with the Public Safety Committee to outline policies as well as identify a K-9 handler within the department.
- October-January: Identify and submit grant applications available for this program
- October 2016 - November 2017: Develop a fundraising campaign, which may include community events, direct fund solicitation, and other events during NNO, for this program in the hope of securing all funds necessary to begin the program in January 2018.
- January 1, 2018: Launch the New Richmond Police Department K-9 program

**CITY OF NEW RICHMOND
K-9 UNIT DONATION AGREEMENT**

THIS DONATION AGREEMENT (“Agreement”) is entered into this ___ day of _____, 2016, by and between the City of New Richmond (“City”) and _____ (“Donor”).

RECITALS

- A. The City operates a Police Department.
- B. The City and its Police Department currently rely upon the assistance of the St. Croix County Sheriff’s Department for the support and assistance of its K-9 unit.
- C. Nearly sixty percent (60%) of all calls for K-9 assistance to the St. Croix County Sheriff’s Department involve matters in and around the City of New Richmond.
- D. The City desires and intends to purchase a K-9 to support various Police Department activities within its corporate jurisdiction including drug detection, missing person searches, building searches, school safety and public relations.
- E. The City has solicited private donations to pay for the purchase of the K-9.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement, City and Donor agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. **CONTRIBUTION.** Donor hereby agrees to contribute and donate to the City, the sum of \$_____ which shall be used for the purchase of a K-9, its training, certification, food, veterinary services, bedding, kenneling and a K-9 equipped squad car by the City of New Richmond. The contribution may be used for other purposes in support of the K-9 as determined in the sole discretion of the City.
- 2. **SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity of any provision of this Agreement shall not impair the validity of any other provision. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, that provision will be deemed severable and the Agreement may be enforced with that provision severed or as modified by the Court.
- 3. **BINDING EFFECT.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of City and Donor.
- 4. **GOVERNING LAW.** This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the statutes and common laws of the State of Wisconsin.

5. **COUNTERPARTS.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, all of which taken together shall be deemed one original.



SUBJECT: 2017 Special Services Police Vehicle

Background:

At the August 8, 2016 staff recommended and City Council approved the request for quote for one new special services police vehicle to replace the 2014 Dodge Durango.

Requests for proposals for an SUV with a V-6 engine and delivery after January 1, 2017 were hand delivered to all three local dealerships on September 6, 2016 and also placed on the City of New Richmond's website with a due date of September 19, 2016 at 4:00P.M.

One quote was received from Bernards Northtown for a 2017 Dodge Durango.

Recommendation:

During this process local dealerships contacted the police department and indicated there are more options available for Police Special Services patrol cars if the scope of the search were expanded to include V-8 motors and AWD sedan type vehicles. These vehicles are also pursuit rated.

Staff recommends the quote process be expanded to include SUV's, V-6 or V-8 Motors and sedan type vehicles with a return date of October 4, 2016 at 4:00pm. The summary of quotes would then be presented to Council at the October 10, 2016 council meeting.

SUBJECT: Master Planning Process

BACKGROUND

As part of the Community Commons land transfer agreement between the City of New Richmond and the School District of New Richmond, a jointly approved master plan is required to be completed for the site by December 31, 2016. The intent of the master plan is to provide a general guide for future development within this specific site area. Within this guide will be a general history of the area, outlining land uses, topographic conditions, and conceptual ideas for future development.

During the work session on September 28, 2016, City staff will present a timeline for community input as well as general concepts for consideration. Within these concepts will include designating this area for a mix of uses, rather than a stand-alone library building. The creation of a mixed-use site, as one concept, is to be afforded the idea of infusing additional financial resources to the future construction of a library. Furthermore, a public-private concept with a variety of community partners would allow for a more collaborative process.

A mixed-use site could include additional recreational spaces such as a splash pad park, additional community space such as a community kitchen, as well as several "lots" for private use (small-box retail/commercial or residential), with the proceeds of the sale of those lots going back into the overall construction budget of the community library/community space.

The financial hardship of a stand-alone community library will be raising the estimated capital needed to construct this building. As such, it is the recommendation of staff, that this master

plan include mixed-use designation which *could* include a public-private partnership. Without such designation, we may be limiting ourselves from future development concepts.

During the week of September 19th, City staff met with staff from the School District of New Richmond about this type of concept. As these decisions require community input and are a policy decision of both the City Council and New Richmond School Board, the intent of this preliminary discussion was to engage both entities in this discussion. Our next step will be to outline general concepts to both groups within the next couple of weeks and set a community meeting to outline concepts in October. Our hope is that an approved master plan would be completed in November or December.
