

PROPOSED ON-STREET BIKE ROUTE

The City of New Richmond is proposing to designate an on-street bike route that would connect the north end of the Doughboy Trail (at the intersection of Pierce Avenue and High Street) with the existing multi-use path at the intersection of West North Shore Drive and Hatfield Court. This route would be a crucial link in the City's multi-modal transportation network, and would provide residents with a means to get from the downtown area to the tunnel underneath STH 64 that connects them to trails in Hatfield and Freedom Parks.

The route will be as shown on the map below, consisting of "shared lanes" on Pierce Avenue, North Third Street, and North Dakota Avenue (south of North Fourth Street), where bicyclists will be guided to travel within the traffic lane, and designated bike lanes on North Fourth Street, North Dakota Avenue (north of North Fourth Street), and West North Shore Drive.

As shown on the below map, on-street parking would be restricted on the west side of Pierce Avenue between High Street and North Third Street, and on both sides of North Fourth Street, North Dakota Avenue (north of North Fourth Street), and West North Shore Drive where designated bike lanes would be marked. The route would be delineated with a combination of pavement markings and street-side signs to guide bicyclists from one end of the route to the other.
