

October is Fire Safety Month

Fire Prevention Week was started by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) in 1922 to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. The NRFD spent time in October visiting classrooms and hosting hundreds of residents at the Fire Station.



A continuous set of three loud beeps-beep, beep, beepmeans smoke or fire. Get out. call 9-1-1 and stay out.



A single chirp every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be changed.



All smoke alarms must be replaced after 10 years.



Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

WINTER PARKING GOES INTO EFFECT NOV 1

NOVEMBER 1 - APRIL 1 | ODD/EVEN PARKING

HOW DOES IT WORK? Overnight parking locations are determined by date and house address. If the date at 6:00 P.M. is odd, you must for that night, park your vehicle in front of an odd numbered house address. If the date at 6:00 P.M. is even, you must for that night, park your vehicle in front of an even numbered address. Example: If you get home at 1:00 A.M. on November 3, you should park as though you got home at 6:00 P.M. on November 2. So in this scenario you would park on the Even side of the street. In general ... ODD is the North and West sides of the street and EVEN is the South and Fast sides of the street
