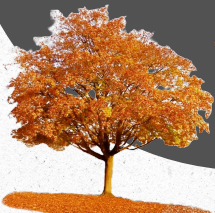

FALL LEAF PICK-UP

City staff will be picking up leaves from residential properties the week of Oct 30th through Nov. 3rd. Leaves must be placed behind the curb in biodegradable PAPER bags to be eligible for pick. Other types of bags will not be picked up and will be the responsibility of the resident to dispose. Any bags placed after Nov. 3rd will not be picked up.

Remember it is illegal to rake, blow or deposit leaves onto the city street.

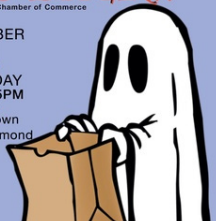

SAFETY SIREN

The installation of the City's fifth emergency warning siren was recently completed. This siren will serve the eastern portion of the City limits, such as the Fox Run and Whispering Prairie neighborhoods, to help notify residents of severe weather. Sirens are activated by St. Croix County Emergency Communications when they are notified by the National Weather Service of severe thunderstorm warnings or tornado warnings.

October is Fire Safety Month

Fire Prevention Week was started by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) in 1922 to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. The NFRD spent time in October visiting classrooms and hosting hundreds of residents at the Fire Station.



A continuous set of three loud beeps—beep, beep, beep—means smoke or fire. Get out, call 9-1-1 and stay out.



All smoke alarms must be replaced after 10 years.



A single chirp every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be changed.



Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

WINTER PARKING GOES INTO EFFECT NOV 1

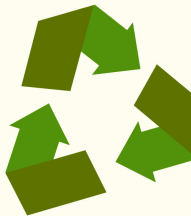
NOVEMBER 1 - APRIL 1 | ODD/EVEN PARKING

HOW DOES IT WORK? Overnight parking locations are determined by date and house address. If the date at 6:00 P.M. is odd, you must for that night, park your vehicle in front of an odd numbered house address. If the date at 6:00 P.M. is even, you must for that night, park your vehicle in front of an even numbered address. Example: If you get home at 1 :00 A.M. on November 3, you should park as though you got home at 6:00 P.M. on November 2. So in this scenario you would park on the Even side of the street. In general ... ODD is the North and West sides of the street and EVEN is the South and East sides of the street
