Community Connectivity

(Transportation & Infrastructure)

Summary: The movement of people to and from various points within a City and their access to larger transportation infrastructure effects everyone and their connections to community life and places of employment, whether near or far. It is an integral aspect of our daily lives and one that requires constant updating and maintenance.

The quality of a City’s infrastructure – streets, trails, sidewalks, intersections, and ease of access to major highways, is a concern to residents and visitors alike. While maintaining a high quality of transportation infrastructure is a challenge for any City, growing communities must keep ahead of increased transportation needs.
